The climate is enviable too – clear days and blue skies are the norm.

Residents have quick and easy access to some of the best recreational opportunities available in the country. Children excel in top quality schools, play in safe neighborhood parks and enjoy the friendliness of our home town charm. MARKET TRENDS

From 2000 to 2010, the population of the Castle Rock Market Area increased **over 100%. Additionally, the Market Area's median home value increased** approximately 52.0%, rising from \$205,419 to \$312,863.24. Experts forecast the average household income will increase from \$107,975 in 2011 to \$126,778 by 2016, or approximately 17.4%.



Culture and Recreation

- Castle Rock is a haven for the outdoor enthusiast. Hiking and biking trails have been expertly planned throughout the community and along natural preserves, complete with picnicking and bird watching areas. 400 acres of state parks, canyons, buttes and other natural outcroppings are favorite destinations for climbing and exploring.
- Castle Rock boasts attractions such as a community theatre and a unique theatre that specializes in magic, illusions and special effects; a wine festival ranked as one of the five best in the state; an international art festival with more than 180 juried artists; historic tours; an authentic castle; in-line hockey rink; multi-plex cinema; fair grounds and event center complex with daily competitions and events, and a summer-long renaissance festival reminiscent of the days of chivalry and jousting and a wildlife museum.
- The Castle Rock Recreation Center features 84,000-square feet of fun with specialty workout areas, basketball and racquetball courts, and a leisure pool complete with water slides, spa and lazy river.
- With great designs and breathtaking Rocky Mountain views, Castle Rock, is home to some of the best courses in all of Colorado. Named in the top 10 best golfing communities, there are over 90 golf courses in the area.



- Within an hour and a half drive from Castle Rock, there are opportunities for skiing, white water rafting, fishing, biking, hiking, camping and horseback riding.
- Denver has a full compliment of professional sports teams including the **NFL's Denver Broncos, the NBA's Denver Nuggets, Colorado Rockies** Baseball, and the **NHL's Colorado Avalanche**. Other spectator sports include the world's largest rodeo held each year at the National Western Stock Show in January.
- Pikes Peak Country is located 30 miles south of Castle Rock and features more than 40 attractions including the Air Force Academy, the famous Broadmoor Resort with its lake and three golf courses, the Pro Rodeo Hall of Fame and Garden of the Gods, which features gigantic 500-foot red sandstone rock monuments at the base of Pikes Peak.
